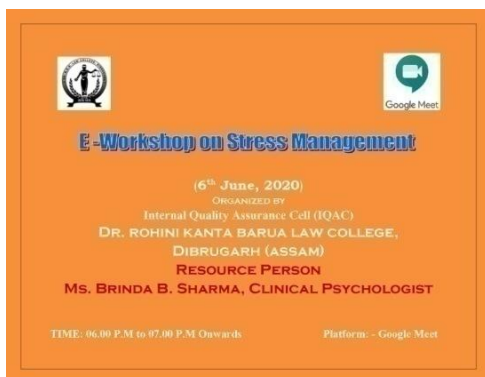
## Parents Teachers Meeting

### WHAT IS THE CODE ON WAGES?



Any action taken under the above enactments including any notification, nomination, appointment, order or direction made or any amount of wages paid shall be deemed to have been done under the Code on Wages unless it is contrary to the provisions of the Code and until such time that they are repealed by the provisions of the Code or a notification to that effect issued by the Central Government.

#### CODE ON OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY, HEALTH AND WORKING CONDITIONS 2019

#### AND DRAFT LABOUR CODE ON SOCIAL SECURITY & WELFARE



#### THE OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY, HEALTH AND WORKING CONDITIONS CODE, 2019

- Introduced in Lok Sabha on July 23.
- Incorporates the essential features of 13 enactments relating to factories, mines, dock workers, building and other construction workers, plantation labour, contract labour, inter-state migrant workmen, working Journalists and other newspaper employees, motor transport workers, sales promotion employees, beedi and cigar workers, cine workers and cinema theatre workers.
- Applies to establishments employing at least 10 workers, and to all mines and docks.
- It does not apply to apprentices.
- Makes special provisions for certain types of establishments and classes of employees, such as factories, mines, and building and construction workers.
- All establishments covered by the Code must be registered with registering officers.
- Duties of employers: providing a workplace free from hazards that may cause injury or diseases; providing free annual health check-up to employees.
- Rights and duties of employees: taking care of their own health and safety; complying with safety and health standards; reporting unsafe situations to the inspector.

#### WORKING TIME

##### Past 7pm, Before 6am

Women workers, with their consent, may work past 7pm and before 6am, if approved by Centre/states.

#### WORK MANAGEMENT

##### 6 days work

No employee may work for more than six days a week.

##### 20 days

Workers may be employed on not more than 20 days of the period of an year.

■ Employer is required to provide a hygienic work environment with ventilation, comfortable temperature and humidity, sufficient space, clean drinking water and toilets.

##### ₹10,000 fine

If an employee violates provisions of the Code, he will be subject to a fine of up to Rs 10,000.

■ Work hours for different classes of establishment and employees to be provided as per rules prescribed by Centre/states.

■ For overtime work, the worker must be paid twice the rate of daily wages.

##### ₹ 5 Lakh

A violation that leads to the death or an employee's permanent imprisonment of up to two years, or a fine up to Rs 5 lakh, or both.

■ For any other violation where penalty is not specified, employer is liable for Rs 2-3 lakh in penalty.

##### ₹2 to 3 Lakh

For any other violation where penalty is not specified, employer is liable for Rs 2-3 lakh in penalty.

#### THE CODE ON WAGES, 2019

- Parliament passed it on Aug 2
- Regulates wage and bonus payments in all employment where any industry, trade, business, or manufacture is carried out.
- Replaces Payment of Wages Act, 1936; Minimum Wages Act, 1948; Payment of Bonus Act, 1965, the Equal Remuneration Act, 1976.
- Covers all employees. Centre will decide on matters of employees in railways, mines, oil fields, among others. States will decide on employees in other sectors.
- Wages include salary, allowance, or any other component expressed in monetary terms.
- Does not include bonus payable to employees or any travel allowance, among others.
- Fixes 'floor wage' for different geographical areas. Minimum wages decided by Centre and states must be higher than the floor wage.
- Prohibits employers from paying wages less than the minimum wages.
- Prohibits gender discrimination in wages.
- Centre, states can fix number of hours that constitute a normal working day.
- Workers entitled to overtime wages, which must be at least twice the normal rate.

#### FINES AND DUES

■ Fine to an employer who pays an employee less than what's due to him/her is punishable with fine up to Rs 50k.

##### ₹ 1,00,000

2nd such offence within five yrs of the 1st instance would result in a jail term of up to 3 months or fine up to Rs 1 lakh or both.

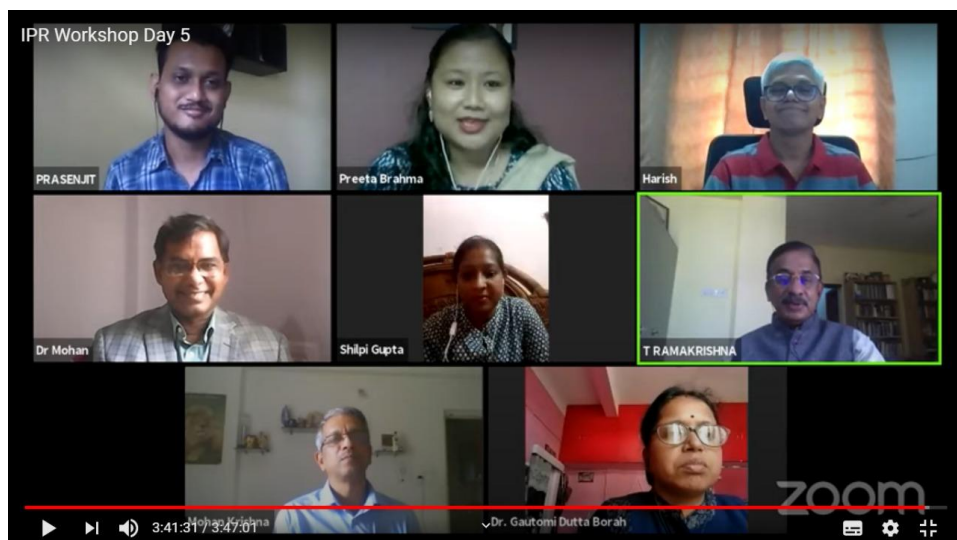

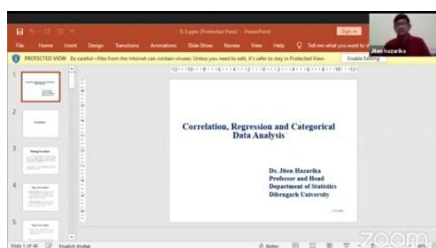

## Observation of International Women Day



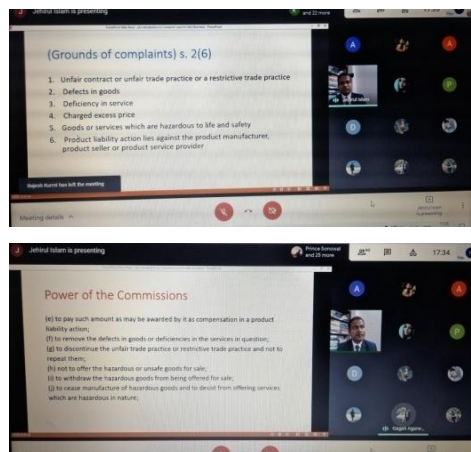

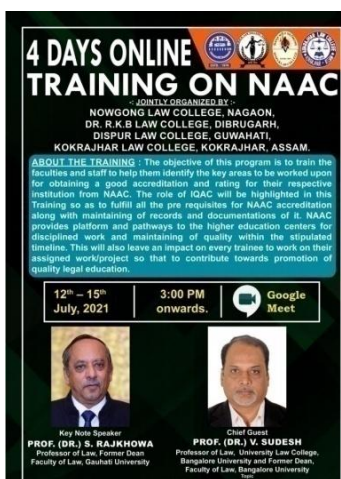
## Observation of International Yoga Day

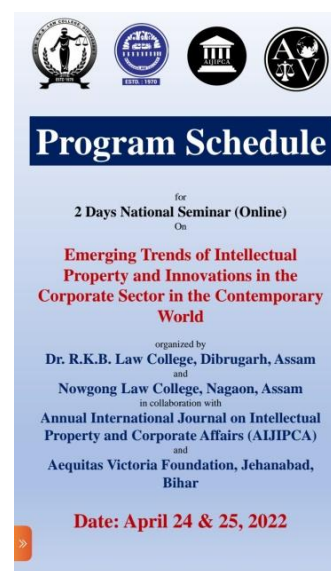
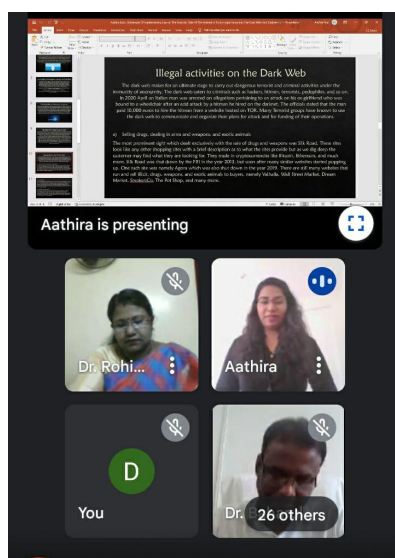
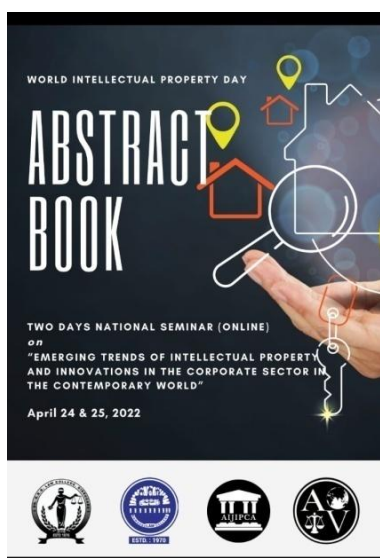
**Observation of Constitutional Day**

From 7th June to 9th June, the IQAC of the college organized Chapter VI of the Series of Lectures on Practical Training on Copyright Law and Geographical Indication. The Resource Person Dr. Ram Ratan V. Dhupal, Asst. Professor of Ajeenkya D. Y. Patil University, Pune, and Ms. Preeta Brahma, Research Scholar of Vel Tech Deemed University, Chennai were invited to hold the sessions. The first day of the practical was held by Dr. Dhupal, who after addressing the teachers and students initiated the explanation of the term 'Copyright'. Analyzing the definition given in the Copyright Act, 1957 under section 14, he stated that copyright includes different kinds of work like literary, dramatic musical, artistic, etc. Through copyright, the owner of the work gets the right to print, publish and sell copies of his or her original work.

Diving into the history of copyright, he stated that the concept of copyright developed first in the United States and then in India when a law was implemented in 1958 describing the salient features of copyright identification, the process of registration, the conditions of infringement, and remedies for the same. He also talked about certain amendments regarding copyright which took place in 1983, 1984, and 1992.

Some of the landmark cases such as the DU Photocopy case, and the Entertainment Network v. Super Cassettes Industries were discussed during the 2<sup>nd</sup> day to give a deep insight into the subject. On 3<sup>rd</sup> and last day, the session was taken over by Ms. Preeta Brahma, who gave a detailed analysis of Geographical Indication. She stated the session mentioning the importance of GI as one of the Intellectual Property Rights. She held that GI is granted to such goods which have the subject matter of identification, geographical origin, quality, and reputation. She referred to different kinds of goods which have GI and different kinds of GI. She then talked about the stages of the pre-registration and registration process and the effects of registration.

The resource person Ms. Preeta Brahma also talked about an important case on GI namely Banglar Rosogolla v. Odisha Rasagola. In concluding the session, she talked about the rights granted to Geographical Indication holders such as the right to grant licenses to others, the right to sell, the right to get relief, etc. Thus, a successful practical session was called together which helped the students to understand the concepts in a better way.

### 14<sup>th</sup> August Capacity Building Programme on Pursuing Higher Studies and Undertaking Research Activities in Foreign Countries



On August 14, 2022, a virtual event on the theme Capacity Building Programme on Pursuing Higher Studies and Undertaking Research Activities in Foreign Countries was organized by the Acqutias Victoria Foundation on the occasion of its third Foundation Day, in association with Dr. R.K.B. Law College, Dibrugarh, Assam, and C.K.B College, Teok, Assam. The event was conducted on the Google Meet Platform from 10:00 AM to 11:30 AM.

The event was enlightened by three foreign resource persons namely: Dr. Amit Kumar, Health Services Researcher & Assistant Professor, Northern Arizona University, USA; Dr. Mandeep Kaur, Postdoctoral Research, Associate at University of Virginia, USA; and Mrs. Twisha Chandra, Global Trade Compliance Professional & Former Financial Crimes Manager, Accenture. The event was moderated by Mr. Sarthak

Aryan, Student from National Law University and Judicial Academy Assam (NLUJAA). There were more than 100 participants from across the country who represented different streams and institutions.

After the session was introduced by the moderator, a healthy interaction was followed where the moderator asked a number of questions to all the resource persons individually which included key questions regarding pursuing higher education and undertaking research activities in foreign countries. Some of those questions include, how to prepare mentally for such an opportunity, what are the opportunities available for Indian students to undertake foreign education, how to avail them, what type of mindset is required for such preparation, expenses required, etc.



While addressing those questions, the resource persons replied that foreign countries' culture is totally different and that also different from one region to another. It is highly required to be more selective in choosing words for deliberations and interactions since the locals of such countries are highly sensitive. Racist comments or any such other religious or political opinions shall be avoided between peer groups because their culture is quite sensitive to all these exposures, unlike Indian culture. Their food habits are different so Dr. Mandeep Kaur warned that it might be quite difficult for a vegetarian to adjust in the USA. The culture of both UK and USA is very liberal. It also necessary not to be introverted and to adjust with the peer. They also suggested that their work culture is also different and they are highly professional in their approach.

Regarding opportunities they suggested that there are many funding agencies that are assisting students of Indian origin in pursuing higher education in the foreign countries. They also suggested to read newspaper on a daily basis for regular updates. They commented on the criteria in USA as well as in UK for getting admission in reputed universities and how to select a particular university based on rankings.


They also spoke on different challenges that an Indian student might face particularly women students. They even suggested to be prepared financially and to calculate the ratio between investment and return that one can expect to secure after getting the degree. Further, they enlightened the students on various topics relating to research and publication.


After the formal deliberation from all the resource persons was over, the moderator opened the feedback form where participants were asked to put their questions, if they had any. Further, the platform was also opened for direct interaction where many participants put various questions. Some of which included concerns regarding Foreign Exams and security of the Indian students pursuing education in foreign countries in the midst of global tension due to the ongoing war between Ukraine and Russia. The Resource persons replied that entrance examinations in the form of GEMS is only required for admission in USA and there also many universities are planning to put an end to such kind of examinations. Further, regarding security concerns, the resource persons replied that in each department of the universities there are special security cells already implemented for the purpose of any emergency. However, all the resource persons suggested strongly to have a close study of the situations in and around the University where one wants to pursue higher education before his/her enrolment and for this purpose it is necessary to have communication with the alumni of that particular University/.

With all these interactions and deliberations, the event came to the final stage where the Souvenir 2022 of Aequitas Victoria Foundation was released. Later, with a formal vote of thanks to all the resource persons individually, heads of the associating institutions, organizers, technical support stuff and at last to all the participants, the meeting was finally concluded.

A virtual class was organized by the IQAC of Dr. R.K.B. Law College, Dibrugarh, Assam on September 13, 2022, from 10:20 AM on the topic **Provisions of Arrest and Attachment of Property** as part of the Series of Lecture (Chapter VII) of Practical Training in the Smart Classroom of the institution. The Resource Person for the event was Prof. Dr. C.S. Raghu Raman, a former Professor of various institutions and presently a Visiting Professor of various Judicial Academies across India. The event was moderated by Dr. Manomita Paul and Mr. Jayanta Boruah, Assistant Professors from Dr. R.K.B. Law College.

The session started sharply at 10:30 AM with a warm introduction of the Resource Person and then the Resource Person started his deliberations on the said topic. During the session, the Resource Person dealt with several aspects of Cr. P.C starts with the issuance of summons and warrants. The conditions that a Police Officer-in-charge shall satisfy before arresting a person and the rights of a private person to arrest were discussed in a lucid manner. He tried to elaborate on all the major provisions relating to arrests with practical examples from daily life. In his deliberation, he also analyzed the powers and jurisdictions of the police officers that are not expressly mentioned in the Cr.P.C.

After explaining the provisions of arrest, he started focusing on the provisions of the Proclamation which he argued as the middle provision between arrest and attachment of property. He mentioned the situations when Proclamation is made and then he went on to explain the aftermath of the Proclamation which is the attachment and sale of the property. He elaborated almost all the necessary provisions on these three vital aspects including arrest, proclamation, and attachment of property.

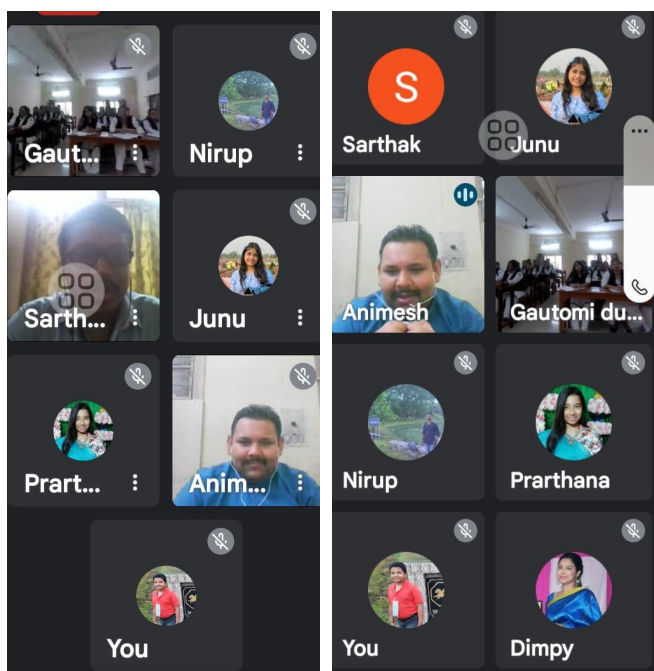
At the end, the session was opened for question and answer by the students where questions like eligibility of private persons for arresting any other person under Cr.P.C. was put to the Resource Person for re-explanation. The Resource Person explained the relevant provisions required for answering all those questions.



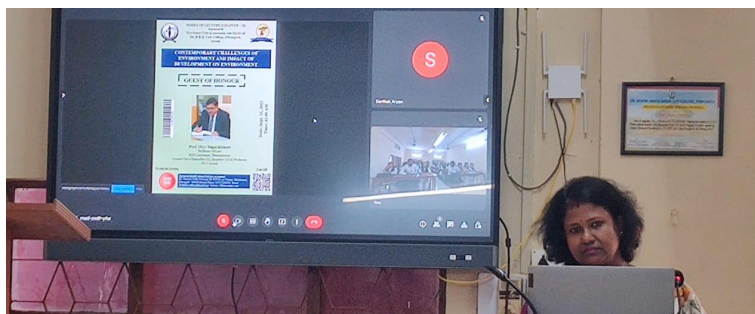

He covered some of the important topics like techno sphere, increasing population and the problems associated with that.

### **Constitution Day Celebration with the D.S.H. Kanoi College**

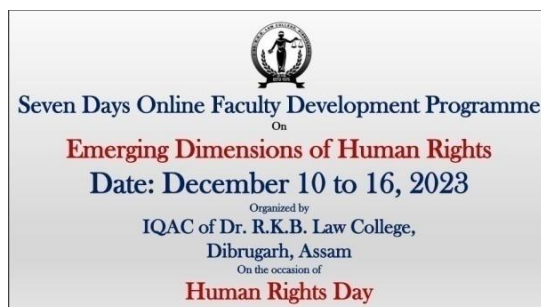

The event was chaired by the Principals of both the colleges Dr. Sashi Kanta Saikia and Dr. Gautomi Dutta Bora respectively, the HOD of the Political Science Department of D.S.H.K College, Dr. L. Doungel and by Mr. Iqbal Ahmed, Senior Journalist and Former President of All Assam Journalist Forum. The theme of the event was Democracy, Constitution and Role of Media in India. The event was an outcome of a MOU signed between both the institutions previously on November 17, 2023. The event began with the ceremony of lighting

of lighting of the lamp and paying tribute to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. It was followed by an introductory speech presented by Dr. L.Doungel. The Principal of Dr. R.K.B. Law College delivered the welcome speech. It was then followed by the Reading of the Preamble by Mr. Siddhant Jaishwal, General Secretary of the Dr. R.K.B. Law College Students' Union and the Preamble was recited by the audience along with Jaishwal. The event was inaugurated by the Principal of D.S.H.K College. The resource person Mr. Iqbal Ahmed spoke on the main theme of the event and beautifully highlighted all the important aspects of democracy, the Constitution of India and the Role of Media in maintaining the spirit of Constitutional Democracy in India. He initiated his speech by explaining the meaning and the types of democracy, freedom of speech and the concept of constitutional governance. He then highlighted that how media actually originated from the basic roots of communication. He even spoke on the aspects of verification of the authenticity of the news published or broadcasted by the media and the factors that influences the functioning of the journalists. He concluded his speech by explaining the newly emerging concept of 'Media Imperialism' and the conversion of 5Ws to 5Cs. Most notably during his speech he remarked that the American Constitution at a very early stage recognized the Freedom of Press but India being the world's largest democracy has failed to recognize such a freedom yet in the Constitution that unfortunately causes obstacles in exercising such freedom by the Indian media. His speech was followed by an interactive session where the students from both the institution participated and the deliberations of the resource persons made the session even more enlightening. Finally, the formal Vote of Thanks was delivered by Dr. Biraj Dutta, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, D.S.H.K College. At last the event was concluded by the performance of the State Anthem by the students of Dr. R.K.B. Law College. The entire event was moderated by Dr. Jayanta Boruah, Assistant Professor, Dr. R.K.B. Law College. It was attended by the faculties of both the institutions and almost 100 students from both the institutions.
